be paid in two annual payments one and
two years after my decease to my son Amos
K Tooker the sum of five dollars to my
son William H Tooker the sum of Ten dollars
payable three years after my death to Mary
Ann Sergeant my daughter the sum of fifty
dollars in three years after my decease to my
daughter Pamela C Tyler the sum of fifty
dollars payable three years after my
decease to my daughter Deborah Jane
Brown the sum of Fifty dollars pay
able three years after my decease
to my daughter ~~Sarah~~ E Gillis the
sum of Fifty dollars payable four
years after my decease to my daughter
Julia Van Buskirk the sum of fifty
dollars payable four years after my
death to my daughter Delilah Cugley³

the sum of Fifty dollars pay in Five
years after my decease to my daughter
Mariah C B Slanson the sum of fifty
dollars payable five years after my
decease. To my son Hawkins Tooker I do
hereby give and bequeath all my estate
both real and personal of whatever
nature or nature subject to the payment
of the above legacies and to a comfortable
support and maintenance of my wife
Sarah Tooker during her natural life
as long as she remains unmarried
and I do hereby constitute and appoint my
son Hawkins Tooker Executor of this my
last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all other Wills and Testaments by me
